Opening Prayer of Confession (together)

The Sacrament of Holy Communion

Leader: Dearly Beloved, in the name of Jesus Christ I invite to this meal all who love and follow Jesus.

People: We remember that Jesus said, "I am the Bread of Life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

Leader: As the Lord Jesus, on the same night in which he was betrayed took bread, I take these elements of bread and wine to be set apart from all common uses, to this holy use and mystery.

People: And as he gave thanks, let us draw near to God and present our prayers and thanksgivings.

Leader: Creator God, you made this wonderful world for us to live in. You showed us how to care for it and take care of each other. We thank you and praise you.

People: You gave us Jesus to be our friend and to bring us closer to you. He died on a cross, but you brought him to life, to live with us forever.

Leader: You send us your Spirit and bring us to the table. For all your goodness we give you thanks and praise.

People: Holy, holy, holy Lord, power of life and love! Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest!

Leader: In this Lenten time we worship and bless your name.

People: We proclaim Christ's death, celebrate Christ's resurrection, and await Christ's coming again.

Leader: Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and what we do here, that we may be signs of life and love to each other and to the world.

People: At this time, we remember those with whom you would have us share your feast. We pray for all who are sad or in pain; all who are sick or alone; all who are hungry or afraid.

Leader: We pray for the nations as they strive for peace; for the earth and all its creatures; for our families and friends. Loving God, we ask that you hold these people in your love: (*prayers of the people*). Let us pray as Jesus taught.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Leader: Now we do as Jesus did the night before he died. He took bread, gave thanks, broke it (*break bread*), gave it to his disciples and said, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Leader: After supper he took a cup of wine (*pour wine into cup*) and said, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Sharing the Meal: People of all ages and backgrounds are welcome to take part in communion. It will be served in the pews. The bread is served first: please keep it until everyone has been served and we will then eat it together. We use juice for the cup. Everyone will be served; we will then drink together.

After bread is distributed: "Jesus Christ, the Bread of Life."

After juice is distributed: "Jesus Christ, the Cup of Blessing."

Leader: We thank you, O God, for the bread we have eaten, the wine we have tasted, the life we have received.

People: May what we have done and been given today remain in our hearts. Send us forth, O God, in faith, hope and love. Amen.
